Sackville Resident Rod Allen is Grateful for Care Received Following Heart Attack

In the early morning hours of July 17, Rod, a long-time Sackville resident and former businessman, woke up at his cottage near Bayfield ready to take on the day. That is when it all changed. He felt pains in his chest; something wasn't right. Rod was suffering a heart attack.

The ambulance was called and he was taken swiftly to the Sackville Memorial Hospital (SMH). While on route Rod's heart stopped and paramedics performed CPR. Once

arriving at the hospital, he was well looked after by the efficient ER (Emergency Room) team. After being evaluated, treated and stabilized he was transferred to Saint John where he underwent emergency surgery receiving two stents for blocked arteries. Following a brief stay in the ICU at The Moncton Hospital, Rod was back at the SMH where he continued to receive exceptional care.

"I was lucky. I can't say enough about the care I received and if it

wasn't for having the hospital so close by, I would likely not be here today," says Rod.

"My wife Brenda and I have four grown children and nine great grand-children and we have had our share of hospital visits. Our hospital has always been there for us and we are forever grateful to have this wonderful facility in our community. We urge all Sackville and Tantramar area residents to continue to give to the Foundation to support the SMH."

\$100,000 goal reached!

The success of the **Focus on Patient Care Campaign** means that among other things, the SMH will have two new high-tech wireless **electrocardiograms** (ECGs) to improve patient care. An ECG is a painless, non-invasive test to check the problems with the electrical activity in the heart and this wireless technology allows ECG results to be transferred immediately into the system so that a physician in Moncton can determine diagnosis and

treatment. Other items that will be purchased from campaign funds are six modern **hospital beds** for Brunswick Unit, a **shoulder instrumentation tray** (houses a wide array of innovative shoulder instruments to allow surgeons to perform difficult procedures with ease through a scope), three **overbed tables** and an **electronic card access system** in both the Laboratory and the Operating Room (OR) to enhance privacy and the overall level of security for patients and staff. All equipment should be operational by the end of the year.

Pauline Spatz

The Foundation was saddened to learn of the passing of 91-year-old Pauline Spatz who died peacefully at her home on July 19. Pauline, a former nurse, was a Foundation board member for nine years (Chair from June 2001 to June 2002) and a member of the Auxiliary since 1972. She will be fondly

remembered for her dedication and commitment in helping shape and lead the Foundation to fulfilling its mission. One of the Foundation projects she was most proud of was the creation of the donor recognition program/wall which was unveiled in 2002. She was also instrumental in having a book written and published (*A Duty Toward the Living: A History of Healthcare in Tantramar* by J.A. Burnett). For years, Pauline was a familiar face at all donor events and in particular the annual general meetings which she always took the time to attend to publicly thank the Foundation.




Foundation Awards Bursaries
