
# **Joe McKinnon** is Indebted to the SMH and its **Healthcare Team**

I am very grateful that the Sackville Memorial Hospital is so close to home.

Sixty year old Joe McKinnon has been doing all the right things and taking care of his health. The retired Atlantic Regional Director of Community Infrastructure and Environment for Indigenous and Northern Affairs Canada in Amherst is a non-smoker. He was eating properly, exercising, and not overweight. But despite this regime, Joe suffered a heart attack in the early morning hours of December 16, 2016. Shortly after waking up, he experienced pain in his lower arms.

"I was alarmed but not too panicked...I took two aspirins and proceeded to ask my wife Roxanne to roll the pain out of my arms with a rolling pin." Roxanne would have none of that, and after shovelling out from a storm the night before, she quickly drove him to the Sackville Memorial Hospital.

Upon arrival in the Emergency Room (ER), the medical staff moved swiftly to treat Joe for a heart attack. Once stable, Joe was transported to the Saint John Regional Hospital where he underwent surgery to have a stent inserted to clear a badly blocked artery. Joe is recovering nicely and watching his diet more closely.



Joe and his wife, who have lived in Sackville for over 20 years, are so very thankful to have the SMH just a short distance away from their home. "It takes a lot of pressure off you in the heat of the moment and alleviates a lot of the anxiety knowing you can be treated just minutes away from home. I may not have made it otherwise."



Campaign 2017

In March, the Sackville Memorial Hospital Foundation launched its **Give our Surgeons Inside**Information Campaign 2017.
The campaign has an ambitious
\$100,000 fundraising goal which will enhance surgical and emergency cardiac care at the SMH.

On the list to purchase this year is a portable Mini C-arm X-ray device for the Day Surgery Program. The SMH is renowned for its outstanding Day Surgery Program offering over 40 different types of Orthopedic, Plastic, Urology and General surgeries. In fact, over 920 surgeries were performed at our facility last year alone. This technology, which carries a price tag of \$85,000, will expand and enhance the hospital's surgical capabilities by offering a host of plastic and orthopedic surgeries not currently being done. This low-radiation, high-resolution technology renders exceptionally detailed X-rays allowing surgeons to safely and accurately operate on bones and joints, as well as visualize hardware (plates and screws) for placement or removal. The portable Mini C-arm can be used in a wide range of foot, ankle and hand surgical procedures including identifying fractures, dislocations, repairing joint deformity (toe fusions), bunion removal, and straightening and securing broken bones to facilitate healing. Dr. Jayson Dool, Plastic Surgeon, is delighted that patients needing certain hand, wrist, foot or ankle surgeries will soon have the option to come to Sackville.

"This acquisition is a benefit for the patients (flexibility and decreased wait times), hospital, and for our orthopedic and plastic surgeons," says Dr. Dool.

## Also on the list to purchase...

A lifesaving device offering optimal cardiac emergency care is urgently required for the Brunswick West Unit (21-bed inpatient unit). It is critical to have a modern defibrillator ready and close by when needed by our medical team. A new defibrillator will replace the one currently being used which is reaching the end of its reliability. This device features innovative technology used to treat a person when their heart stops beating properly, delivering an electric shock to stimulate the heart to get it pumping effectively again. It also works as an external pacemaker as well as allows staff to monitor crucial information such as cardiac rhythms and vital signs. Having a designated defibrillator in the Brunswick West Unit saves the response team precious time, minutes that could save a life, without having to use one from another area of the hospital.

### Improving **Patient Care** Together

to be transferred immediately into the system so that a physician in Moncton can determine diagnosis and treatment.

Other items purchased from 2016 campaign funds and already in use are six modern hospital beds for Brunswick Unit, a shoulder instrumentation tray (housing a wide variety of innovative shoulder instruments to allow surgeons to perform difficult procedures with ease through a
