2014 Campaign **Let's not miss a Beat** Goal Exceeded

Success means better technology and enhanced patient care thanks to generous donors

The Sackville Memorial Hospital's (SMH) Emergency Room (ER) is now the home for a new Cardiac Monitoring System. Thanks to the generosity and support of its donors, the SMH Foundation's 2014 Campaign, **Let's not miss a Beat**, raised just over \$108,000 exceeding the \$100,000 target set last March.

A Cardiac Monitoring System was urgently needed to replace an existing one which was over 14 years old and past its life expectancy. The modern system will strengthen our medical professionals' ability to provide the best emergency care to patients in our community.

The Cardiac Monitoring System is a critical component in the ER as this technology displays a patient's vital

signs including heart rate, pulse and blood pressure. Monitors can detect arrhythmias and any other significant cardiac developments as early as possible. Many situations in the ER are time sensitive. It is crucial for our medical team to have the ability to diagnose a patient's condition quickly and accurately, as in some instances, the patient may need to be transported to another facility for

more advanced care. The Cardiac Monitoring System is used on patients in the ER who may be experiencing a heart attack, heart failure, unstable heart arrhythmia, abnormal heart rhythm, pneumonia and other cardiac related diseases and conditions.

The SMH assists on average four patients a day in the ER who require cardiac monitoring; in total over 1,450 patients per year make use of this vital piece of technology.

It consists of four monitors; three of which are at each bedside in the ER observation room. The other is in the trauma room. All monitors are connected to the main monitor in the ER nurses station. The system's actual cost is \$135,000. The balance of funds will come in part from the Horizon Health Network and from donations previously received.

Campaign Chair Elaine Smith expressed gratitude to all those who contributed to the success of the

campaign. "We are very fortunate to have the continued support of many loyal volunteers, donors and staff as well as corporate partners in the community." The Foundation held a thank you event in November, where donors also had a chance to view the updated donor recognition wall located in the hospital lobby.

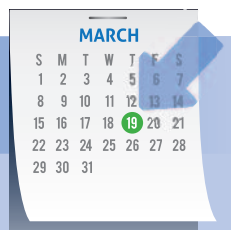
Foundation Partners with Open Sky Co-operative Ltd.

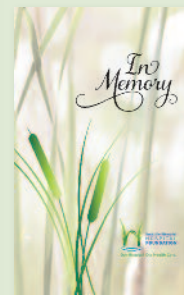
